Our flagship event: PROCESA moved in its sixth version to the city of **Barranquilla** during the week of April 9-14. The AIChE chapter of the Universidad del Atlántico was in charge of directing the VI Technical Conference, which had the following thematic axes: **Biotechnology, Food Engineering, Economic Engineering** and **Project**



Management. During the event, the regional **Chem-E-Car** and **Jeopardy** competitions were held, which are governed by the guidelines of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE). Our chapter (and our university) was represented in both competitions, **achieving first place in the Jeopardy**, which allows the team to represent us in the international competition that will be held at *Annual Student Conference 2018* in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA.

New name for the Newsletter: The Redactor


